BAPTISM OF INFANTS: blessings on the birth of your child!

These take place bimonthly, at 1:00 p.m. (except in Lent). Those wishing to have their child baptized should contact the parish office at least two months in advance -- the parish website has a registration form. If you are able to do so, introduce yourself to the pastor.

ADULT INITIATION / RECEPTION

Adults (and older children) inquiring into Christian living or Catholic practices join together in a gradual process or journey (Catechumenate) bound for the sacraments.

FIRST COMMUNION / CONFESSION / CONFIRMATION

Children must register with the parish to receive these sacraments. Orientation sessions are held in the fall; Communion, Confirmation are celebrated in the spring.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

A Holy Hour of Adoration occurs on the first Thursday of the month, following the Mass. Contemplate the supreme gesture of love contained in the consecrated Bread.

MARRIAGE: congratulations on your engagement!

Anyone wishing to be married at our church should contact the parish office at least one year prior: this is a popular wedding venue! Besides a series of meetings with a priest, a diocese-approved form of pre-marriage preparation is considered necessary.

RECONCILIATION

This is celebrated weekly for individuals wishing to experience sacramental forgiveness – Fridays 9:00-10:00 a.m., first Saturdays 7:30-8:30 a.m., more hours seasonally.

MINISTRY OF CARE TO THE SICK

Holy Communion and Sacrament of Anointing are available to any who are ill or housebound or seeking pastoral care. Notify the parish office to make arrangements. Advise the church office of hospital admissions or let the pastor know directly. Anointing should not be delayed until a person's final hours.

CATHOLIC FUNERAL RITES

Once you have contacted the funeral home of your choice to make arrangements, the parish will then be called. We have a Bereavement Ministry to assist you throughout.

SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD

"I hope in your Word" (Psalm 119)

In his Apostolic Letter <u>Aperuit Illis</u> (dated Sept. 30, 2019 — the feast of St. Jerome), Pope Francis proposed that the entire Church celebrate a "Sunday of the Word of God," the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, set aside to reflect on the great importance of God's word for everyday living. The title of the document is from its opening words, taken from Luke's Gospel, where the evangelist describes how the Risen Jesus appeared to his disciples, and how "he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures." St. Jerome was the one who translated most of the Bible into Latin, and who said: "ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ."

MINISTERS OF GOD'S WORD (Sunday & Weekly Readers)

Today we are renewing the commitment of our parish's Word Proclaimers, of which we have some 25 readers (including four recently added). They are a real gift in our parish and they turn the gift of speech into an act of love. These ministers make our inaudible God audible and our invisible God visible. ALPHA -- IN A CATHOLIC CONTEXT



Having been introduced to Alpha by Nick Ali, Director of the diocese's Office of Evangelization, we are proceeding with the launch of a "pilot Alpha" for our parishioners in the coming weeks. The pilot runs for seven sessions and includes an all-day retreat. We are aiming to host this Alpha experience on Thursdays (Feb. 27, Mar. 6, 13, 20, 27, Apr. 3, 10).

Those interested in participating (and we hope many of you will!) are asked to add their names and best contact info to the <u>sign-up sheet</u> near the church doors (or else notify the parish office) by <u>no later than February 10</u>.

Alpha is an interesting, fun, and non-threatening way to explore Christianity. It provides a "refresher" for committed Christians to look at the basics of the faith. The topics explore the "big issues," addressing questions like "is there more to life than this? who is Jesus? why and how do I pray? how does God guide us?" It is "tuition-free;" however, free will donations to cover the cost of the meals will be accepted. Typically, each Alpha session (of two-and-a-half hours max.) begins with a meal and continues with a half-hour video and small group sharing afterwards. We will be assembling a core team (leader, administrator, small group hosts and helpers, task force, prayer team).

"100 SCARVES" GROUP

February 7 (1:00-4:00 p.m., in the hall). Whether you're a "seasoned pro" or a beginner, come and share the joy of crafting with us. We look forward to seeing you there!

BEREAVEMENT MINISTRY

This is a ministry of accompaniment (a notion dear to Pope Francis). Basically, when a call is received for a funeral, a bereavement minister gets in touch with the family and meets to plan the funeral liturgy (readings, homily notes, prayer of the faithful, music). If any bereavement ministers are free to attend the prayer vigil and/or the liturgy, so much the better, as some families have difficulty proposing readers. As well, the minister(s) could help set up what is needed for the funeral and in order for the priest not to be delayed in moving on the burial, they could tidy up and lock the church. We are meeting this Wednesday, January 29 (6:30 p.m., rectory), and we welcome anyone who feels this ministry would suit them. Give consideration to this -- and many thanks to those presently serving!

SENIOR ALTAR SERVERS

Men and women of the parish who are available to serve when a funeral Mass occurs are invited to a short "training session" this Wednesday, January 29 – immediately following the 8:30 a.m. Mass. In fact, these "senior servers" may step in at other times, as happens now at some of our Sunday Masses.

WORDONFIRE "CATHOLICISM: THE PIVOTAL PLAYERS"

This DVD series explores the creative outpouring of some of the greatest writers, artists, and spiritual minds in Christian history. Their lives are animated by Bishop Robert Barron (Word on Fire Catholic Ministries), and they can motivate each of us to live the adventure of our faith in new and unexpected ways. A viewing of St. Thomas Aquinas, the Theologian will take place in the hall this Monday, January 27 right after the morning Mass (approx. 9:15) -- in anticipation of his memorial the next day. Tea/coffee/light snack will be available.

DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE: mobilizing together



This weekend a number of parishioners will receive in the bulletin a copy of the action sheet "Create Hope -- Reaping Our Rights," in anticipation of a signature collection taking

place the following Sundays. Essentially, we are raising awareness about the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Peasants and Other People Working in Rural Areas (UNDROP); we call upon the Government of Canada to adopt mandatory human rights and environmental due diligence legislation to compel Canadian companies to prevent, report, and remedy human rights abuses and environmental damage throughout their global operations and supply chains.

ALTAR CANDLES

According to the Roman Missal, "on or next to the altar are to be placed candlesticks with lighted candles: at least two in any celebration, or even four or six, especially for a Sunday Mass or a Holy day of Obligation...Likewise, on the altar or close to it, there is to be a cross adorned with a figure of Christ crucified...On the altar itself may be placed a 'Book of Gospels' distinct from the book of other readings, unless it is carried in the Entrance Procession" (no. 117). We are getting an estimate from our usual liturgical supplier for six such candlesticks which will replace the two candlesticks presently on the altar. Nylon shells (for the oil cans to be inserted) will be a separate cost. Only candles of a decent stature flanking the altar will look presentable. If there is anyone who would like to assist with these purchases, do inform the parish office; all donors will be acknowledged.

<u>PRESENTATION OF THE LORD</u> / "<u>CANDLEMAS</u>" -- Sunday, February 2 (candlelight procession, at all Masses)

We "say goodbye" to Christmas, forty days after our celebration of the birth of Jesus. The Mass begins in an unusual fashion, with a blessing of candles -- either tapers (as at the Easter Vigil) special ones available for purchase and which will be blessed for use at home afterwards (two candles per box; suggested offering \$2).

You will be invited to take part in the opening ritual. When all are in place, the candles will be lit and then blessed. The gathered assembly follows in candlelight procession around the church behind the presider and ministers. The rest of the Mass continues in the usual way.

The annual <u>blessing of throats</u> will take place in the 8:30 a.m. Mass on Monday, February 3 (the feast of St. Blase).
